SUBJECT:	Updated Long-Term Care Sector Surveillance Testing Strategy

Further to my memo dated November 19, 2020, I am writing to inform you that the Minister of Long-Term Care has issued a Minister's Directive: COVID-19: Long-Term Care Home Surveillance Testing And Access to Homes, effective November 23, 2020.

The Minister's Directive requires long-term care home licensees to:

- Ensure staff, students and volunteers working in the home regularly take a COVID-19 test at the intervals as outlined in the Directive.
- For long-term care homes in public health unit regions in Orange-Restrict, Red-Control or Grey-Lockdown levels, ensure that support workers and caregivers demonstrate that they have received a negative COVID-19 test result in the past week, and verbally attest to not subsequently having tested positive (unless the support worker requires immediate access in an emergency situation).
- For long-term care homes in public health unit regions in Green-Prevent or Yellow-Protect levels, ensure all caregivers, all support workers and any general visitors demonstrate that they have received a negative COVID-19 test result and verbally attest to having received a negative COVID-19 test result in the past two weeks and not subsequently tested positive prior to visiting (unless the support worker requires immediate access in an emergency situation).

The Ministry is also releasing an updated COVID-19 Visiting Policy, effective November 23, 2020.

The Minister's Directive will be effective on Monday, November 23, 2020. Long-term care homes should work to implement the requirements for testing immediately and must not allow anyone into a home who has not met the requirements as of November 30, 2020.

Surveillance testing, active screening, infection prevention and control (IPAC) practices, hand hygiene, physical distancing and use of personal protective equipment (PPE) are important measures that will help reduce the risk of COVID-19 in long-term care homes.
