SUBJECT: Resident Absences

As we continue to respond to COVID-19, please take note of this update on absences for long-term care home residents.

The Chief Medical Officer of Health has released an update to COVID-19 Directive #3 for Long-Term Care Homes under the *Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007* (Directive #3), effective August 28, 2020, that provides direction on resident absences from the long-term care home. Under the updated Directive #3, residents may leave the home's property for a short stay or temporary absence.

- **Short stay absences** are for health care-related, social or other reasons and do not include an overnight stay, with the exception of single-night emergency room visits.
- Temporary absences are for personal reasons and for one or more nights. Homes
 must review and approve all temporary absences based on a case-by-case risk
 assessment as outlined in Directive #3.
